RHINELAND-PALATINATE

1. **The *Wine Road* is located in the Pfalz-region which is renowned for its moderate climate, its picturesque villages and of course for its wine. - You can use the city’s own electrical cars specially made for tourists to get to the city’s landmarks.

4. **Since 2015, the region Hunsrück-Hochwald has gained the status of a national park. In order to attract younger tourists and locals to spend their time in the national park, the park’s administration has developed an app for mobile phones. What is the special feature of this app?**

- It analyses the sounds of birds and can directly tell you the bird species you are hearing.

- It features an augmented-reality-ranger: This virtual ranger appears if you scan a QR-code that you can find in the forest. The virtual ranger will tell you a little bit about the forest and you can even make a selfie with him.
